### **Our School Day**

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
A school day is 6 hours and 30 minutes long (from morning registration until the end of the day) meaning that, in a typical week, children spend 32.5 hours at school.

A typical day at Marlborough Infant School consists of:

- 08:35 Line up in courtyard, children taken into school when ready
- 08:40 Children in classrooms
- **08:45** Registration (to be completed by 08:50)
- 15:15 Home time

In the mornings, Year 1 and Year 2 children line up in the courtyard before entering school and Year R children will be taken through the side gate (to the right of the school) to their classroom. This is the same for collection after school.

A member of staff will be available each morning to greet your children and take any messages.



## What we want to achieve

Our aim is to ensure that the children experience a smooth transition from Y1 to Y2.

- The Year 2 curriculum extends the experiences that children have had in Year 1.
- We believe in providing children with a broad and well-balanced curriculum through a range of individual, small group and large group activities.

## Attendance and Punctuality:

Children need to be in school every day and on time.

Face-to-face education is important in helping pupils to fulfil their potential. During school time we believe pupils should be in class with their teachers and peers and enjoying all the benefits that brings.

#### Why is regular attendance so important?

Being in school every day that it is open is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing and their wider development.

Evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results.

#### Punctuality

If your child is consistently late, they may miss out on reading and may fall behind in their attainment. We start every day with reading and phonics lessons at Marlborough Infants so it is crucial they don't miss out on this learning.

It is also really hard for a child to walk in late to a full classroom that has already settled; they will miss out on the normal routines and time to adjust and find out about their day.

## Attendance and Punctuality:

Parents or carers of a child have a legal responsibility to ensure their child receives a suitable education. This is usually achieved through regular attendance at school. Maintained schools **must** only grant leaves of absence for specific circumstances and you must ask the school in advance. Leaves of absence will not be given for holidays and are VERY rarely given!

#### New rules around issuing fines for unauthorised absences

- The new national framework for issuing penalty notices is designed to help ensure consistency across the country.
- Fines will increase to:
- •£80 to be paid within 21 days, or
- •£160 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days

## School Uniform Expectations



## ALL UNIFORM AND BAGS MUST **BE CLEARLY** NAMED

- School jumper (worn or held, not tied around the waist) • White polo shirt - always tucked in
- Black/grey trousers/skirt
- Black shoes (no coloured laces etc...)
- Hair should be tied back if long
- No nail varnish and stud earrings only
- No other jewellery unless for religious reasons

(all jewellery must be removed for PE)

- No rucksacks needed just a book bag and drawstring P.E bag. •

## House keeping rules and contacting us

- Water bottles should be labelled and brought into school every day
- No Nuts please be aware we are a nut free school & there are children with severe nut allergies.

- Birthdays packaged items only, no items that may contain nuts (we have a number of vegetarian/halal children) • Speaking to us - our relationship with parents/carers is really important. The best way is to communicate via email through the office with a reason why you need to speak to us and we will give you a call back or email as soon as we can! SLT are on the gate in the mornings and you can always talk to them as well.







## **PE Information**

PE days are: <u>Tuesdays</u> and <u>Wednesdays</u> for all of Year 2.

- Children should bring in their PE kit on a Monday and keep it in school all week.
  - Indoor PE kit should consist of: shorts, t-shirt and trainers.
  - Outdoor PE kit should consist of the same as the indoor kit, plus
- trainers, tracksuit bottoms and a long-sleeve top for cold weather (all dark colours e.g. black, grey or navy)
  - Long hair should be tied back.
    - No jewellery.
  - For health and safety reasons, staff are not allowed to remove

a child's earrings. This must be done either by the child or their carer beforehand.



Our PE kit consists of:

- a plain white polo shirt or t-shirt
- black shorts
- socks
- trainers or plimsolls

In the colder months, children will need to wear black or dark grey tracksuit bottoms and their school sweatshirt as we often do PE outside, even if the weather is a little cooler.

## Reading

#### In school:


Daily reading lessons /phonics sessions

#### At home:

If the children are still on the RWI scheme, they will take home two decodable books a week (matching the colour they are on. If they are off the scheme, they will take a chapter/longer book home once a week or whenever they finish it.

We would really appreciate it if you could read with your child everyday and record in your child's yellow reading book. (a minimum of 3 times a week) Class teachers will monitor reading records multiple times a week to look for regular readers to reward.

The children's reading books will be changed on a weekly basis and book change is on a Monday. Phonics Support for Parents: <u>Read Write Inc</u> website which is linked on our school website. Book bags need to be brought into school everyday please as there will be opportunities throughout the school day where adults in the classroom will read with the children.






In June last year the children sat their phonics screening test.

Anyone who didn't pass will re-sit.

## Homework

#### Reading

Children need to read daily if possible but at least 3 times a week. PLEASE SIGN THE YELLOW BOOK EVERY TIME THEY READ, WHATEVER THEY READ!

#### Maths

Maths homework will be set on Numbots to help children practice their fluency and mental maths at home. Your child will be given a log in and password; these will be in their yellow reading book.

#### Spelling

Children are given 6 spellings on Monday in their yellow reading records and will have a spelling test on Fridays. These tests will be very informal, nothing to worry about.
